The Cleaning Services Industry

The Cleaning Services industry includes businesses that clean the interior and exterior of buildings and some other cleaning services including street sweeping and cleaning the inside of vehicles.



Maori, Pacific and Asian representation within the cleaning sector is considerably higher than both the total economy and across Ringa Hora sectors. Cleaning has the second highest percentage of Maori, Pacific and Asian workers of all Ringa Hora sectors.

Businesses

1. Number of business



This is about 1% for New Zealand and 2% for the Service sector.

The number of businesses in the Cleaning Services sector grew by 4.9% per year from 2016 - 2021, considerably faster than growth of 1.6% in the NZ economy overall.

The Cleaning sector is heavily concentrated in Auckland. This is higher than both the NZ economy (35% of workers) and Ringa Hora overall (39%) of workers. Compared to the total NZ economy the Cleaning sector has a similar proportion of workers in Wellington and Canterbury and noticeably small share of workers in all regions outside the three main centres.

More than half of all workers in Cleaning Services have no post-school qualification. This compares to 40% of workers in the Service sectors and 38% of workers across the NZ economy.
