


WE ARE TOKONA TE RAKI




Population Growth 15+ Years of Age 2022 - 2040

by Māori, European, All 1986 - 2021








SKILLS CLUSTERS




SHARE OF MĀORI WORKERS IN GROWTH CLUSTERS
